Revving Up...

Dear Friends

As I write this letter it is mid-March and we are half way through Lent, waiting in anticipation for the celebration of Easter, when we remember the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ and his appearances to the disciples during the days following.

Outside my study window and in the hedgerows and fields as I drive around our benefice, and further afield, new life is showing. Lambs are appearing in the fields, blossom and leaves are appearing on the trees and the spring bulbs, snowdrops, daffodils and primroses are in flower. It seems that our approaching Easter festival is a celebration of new life for nature as well as the church.

At the beginning of Lent, on Ash Wednesday, I reflected on a passage from Henri Nouwen's book Finding our Sacred Center, A Journey to Inner Peace. The passage describes Henri's journey through the Stations of the Cross at Lourdes. These 'Stations' are life-sized representations of 14 moments in the last hours of Jesus' life



beginning with "Jesus is condemned to death".

The last 'Station' finds 11 statues surrounding the body of Jesus before it is laid in the tomb. It is at this that Henri guotes part of Thomas Phillipe's reflection on the last Station.

'The Christian life is a continual struggle against the old self. Not just a struggle in the sense of a battle, but a real putting in the tomb....All authentic Christian lives...know these long "tunnels" where one does not see anything anymore, where one understands nothing, where one is disgusted. Jesus makes us descend with him in the tomb, in the weakness, in the darkness, in everything that seems dead





in our heart, but always to rectify us, to purify us, to liberate us.'

Henri writes:

'As I look into the long, deep, dark cave in the rock and see the body of Jesus carried into that darkness, I want to enter with him and let all my selfish needs and desires, all my violence, resentments, lusts and petty jealousies be put there, never to be taken up again.'

In those last few hours of Jesus' life we are invited to take to the cross all those things that we struggle with, the negativity, the unforgiveness, the hurts, pains and grief. In fact we are invited to take to the cross all that makes us feel less than human, the feelings 'that seem dead in our hearts' and to leave it all there. It is at the cross that Jesus takes them up and there they are crucified with him.

They are placed in the tomb with him and there they are left.

On Easter day Jesus broke the bonds of sin and death. The stone was rolled away and when the disciples looked for him he was not there. Jesus is alive and so we are alive with him. A new life. A life that is full of hope because in that tomb Jesus 'rectified us, purified us and liberated us.' As Henri Nouwen left the Stations of the Cross at Lourdes he came upon a 'fifteenth' station. A huge round stone, carved with 'rays' coming from its centre.

'It looks like the sun; it speaks of light and freedom. Its simplicity stops me in my tracks....Beside it are the words: "At the first sign of dawn...they found that the stone had been rolled away." Turning to the other side of the stone I read: "He is risen, as he said he would."

It is here at this stone, rolled aside, revealing an empty tomb, that Henri found peace and solitude. He had been on a journey with Jesus through the last hours of his life. He had 'crucified' and then 'buried' with the body of Jesus all those things that are 'dead in our heart' and at seeing the stone Henri found peace.

When you see the stone, rolled to one side this Easter, I pray that you find the peace you are looking for. When you look into the empty tomb I pray that those things you carry in your heart are no longer there. This Easter I pray that you too find Light and Freedom.

Church Hall

We have had the toilet and kitchen block removed from the back of the Hall. This revealed a serious crack in the side of the main building. A structural engineer was able to come at short notice. Repairs will have to be made. I have asked three builders for quotes. It is likely that this crack had been there for some time. There is very little evidence of the crack inside.

As funds are low after the demolition, it is hoped that we can make the front of the building look as if it is being used. The window needs cleaning and the porch over the front door either needs repairing or removing. Any help would be welcome

I have had a phone call from the ratings officer of the District Council. I said that church halls were exempt. We are now on their register (I think this is so that

the council can get more funding!). I just hope we don't get charged. Fund raising for this will be

Conditions of tower visits:

Adverse weather conditions could result in the tower visits being cancelled. It is a hard climb up the spiral staircase, and the upper steps are fairly worn. Climbers must wear shoes with a good grip (e.g. trainers) and not be suffering from a medical condition which would make the climb inadvisable. You will need both hands free, so cameras and binoculars must be in pockets or in a bag with shoulder strap. The minimum age is 10 yrs., and those under 16 must be accompanied by an adult (one adult per young person). Stewards decision is final. Climbing is at your own risk.

At the Team Rector's request, I have been working on pulling together material from the three previous websites which covered our churches into one new website. The new site is



Dogs on the streets **D**

On Sunday 28 May 2023 I will be riding the 'Ford RideLondon-Essex 100' together with thousands of other cyclists of all abilities. It is described as a 'tough but achievable challenge' covering 100 miles on closed roads starting and finishing in central London.

I have chosen to ride for 'Dogs On The Streets (DOTS)' as it is a charity set up to help the homeless by looking after the needs of their pets. It operates a mobile veterinary surgery,



gives essential items to pet owners on the streets and fosters street dogs. Fostering

enables both the owners and the dogs to get back on their feet, especially in the cold winter months or when suffering from ill health.

DOTS is headed up by Michelle Clark who, prior to the launch of DOTS back in 2016, had already been running a street outreach

programme for six years, tending to the needs of the homeless with dogs, where she steadily built up a strong rapport and in-depth knowledge of their true needs.

Via Michelle's extensive work in this area, the true inspiration for DOTS came



in the waggy-tailed shape of a very special street dog called Poppy who changed Michelle's life forever. Poppy's homeless dad was taken very ill and having heard about Michelle's work made contact to see if she could help with Poppy's welfare while he moved into accommodation to try and better his health.

Michelle has been involved in a number of cases where she has been successful in getting homeless people

and their dogs off the streets for good and hopes to do more of this in the future

The difference between the Suffragettes and the Suffragists (not prepared to use violence) was explained, encouraging the audience members to consider which they would have had the courage to become, at a time when even wearing a badge would have resulted in verbal and even physical abuse.

Melanie showed how the personalities of the key players, many very active but not as well known as the Pankhursts, shaped their

campaigns and even how women's fashion forced change as the years went on. Suffrage for all women, not just those with property, came first in New Zealand, followed by Australia. How enlightened they were 'down under'.

The meeting on 13 March was the Annual Meeting which comprised the voting in of the Committee and election of Officers. Wendy Richley was standing down so we required a new Secretary – thank you Wendy for your sterling efforts. We had some more members tell us 'Something you do not know about me' following the election.



RSPB Dungeness





We have seen the first signs of spring here at RSPB Dungeness this past month, such as buds appearing on the trees and bitterns booming in the reeds. It's an exciting time of year for us with the first swifts and sand martins hopefully being seen mid-March, closely followed by swallows, wheatears, black redstarts and yellow wagtails. Cuckoos should be present from mid-April and there will also be a large increase in warblers. Sedge and reed warblers and whitethroats all nest on the reserve while willow warblers, chiffchaffs, and blackcaps pass through on migration.

In preparation for the breeding season, the team have been busy getting most of the habitat management completed and are now very close with only a few small tasks left before we start the big clean-up and get onto our spring/summer task programme.

This month the team have prioritised clearing willow from two areas of reedbed on the reserve; an area at the south end of ARC and another area along the track to Badgers Field (towards Lydd from the Viewing Ramp). They have also been repairing and relaunching the ARC seabird raft with the hope that a new location will improve seabird species nesting and help with ongoing monitoring.






